Leaf and Yard Waste Pickup to Resume

Springtime is here and that means it's time for yardwork. As we head outdoors to begin the

process of cleaning up our yards, here are some helpful tips for you. The City of Morris' waste hauler, Republic Services, will resume picking up of an unlimited amount of leaf and yard waste the week beginning on April 1st Yard waste should be put into an approved lawn and leaf bag or the garbage container which has the "Yard Waste Only" sticker displayed on the front of the container. This service will run through the

last full week of November. Branches outside of the container must be bundled to a length less than 48" and should weigh no more than 40 pounds.



Park Reservations Open April 1st

You can start reserving City of Morris Park shelters for private use on Monday, April 1, 2024! Reservations are accepted on a first



come, first served basis. Shelters are available from May 1, 2024 through October 15, 2024.

Fees are \$25 for residents and \$50 for non-residents. You can find a complete set of park reservation rules under the "How Do I?" tab at morrisil.org. Applications are available at the City Clerk's window in the Morris Municipal Services Building or online under the "Documents" tab at morrisil.org.

BUILDING AND ZONING CORNER

As the grip of winter breaks and the weather starts to warm up, many local residents will be hiring contractors to replace their roofs. Before you start the work, remember to obtain the necessary roofing permit from the Building and Zoning Department. The cost of the permit is only \$50 and can be obtained by a city-registered contractor or the homeowner. All city-registered contractors are required to provide evidence of bonding and insurance, which serves as protection for you as a homeowner before anybody begins work on you property. Bonded roofers have money set aside to compensate customers if any accidents or damages occur during the roofing project.



Having proper insurance protects you from being held personally responsible for paying the costs of damage to your property, an injury on the job, and any subsequent worker's compensation claims. You can obtain your roofing permit online, under our documents tab at morrisil.org or by visiting the building and zoning office in person. If you have any questions regarding home projects or need help verifying your contractor is registered with the City of Morris, please call Building and Zoning Officer Bill Martin at 815-942-1855.

VEHICLES

- Do not leave your vehicle unattended with its windows down or doors unlocked. Secure your vehicle at all times, even at home!
- If your vehicle is parked outside overnight, be sure to keep it in a lighted area as a deterrent.
- Make sure all valuables are out of sight or removed from your vehicle.
- Do not leave children or pets left unattended in vehicles.
 Please note temperatures inside of a vehicle can be considerably warmer than the temperature outside.
 Excessive heat can cause serious injury or death.

VACATION WATCH

- If you are going out of town, you can notify the Police
 Department and set up a vacation watch. Please call the
 Morris Police Department at 815-941-5233 and request to have
 your residence placed on house check.
- Make sure your home is locked up and secure.
- Stop your mail or have family/friends retrieve it for you.
- Set a light on a timer inside of your home to create the appearance of activity inside.
- Exterior motion sensor lighting and camera systems can aide in deterring crime.
- Keep valuables away from public view through a window or door. Place valuables in a safe if possible.
- Do not post your vacation plans on social media. Post your vacation photos after you safely arrive home.

BIKE RIDING

- Check your bike to make sure the tires are inflated, and the brakes are working. Put reflectors on the front and back of your bike.
- Wear your safety helmet and pads for protection.
- If you ride on the street, keep to the right, and follow all traffic signs.
- Be on the lookout for traffic, yield to vehicles and signal when turning.
- Use the crosswalks and yield to pedestrians. If you have to cross at an intersection, look both ways and cross with care.
- Stay alert and watch out for hazards.
- When you park your bike, make sure you lock it up. Register your bike and serial number with the Morris Police Department before riding.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS

The first day of spring is right around the corner and while Mother Nature might not always agree with that, warmer temperatures are approaching. With the warmer weather and longer days, many people feel a renewed sense of energy

and begin to tackle those projects around their homes they put off during the winter months. Spring cleaning is an important part of keeping your home and family safe from fire and can be overlooked. This spring, make fire safety part of your routine to stay on top of fire prevention in your home, whether you own or rent. Add these tips to your weekend chores list and enjoy the peace of mind that comes with it.

Some families grill year-round, while others bring the grill out again in the spring and summer. While your grill sits over the long winter, grease and build-up hardens and makes it easy work for fire to catch. **Before firing up the grill this spring**, inspect it for damage and remove any trapped grease or debris that may have lingered there. A deep cleaning will help avoid preventable grill fires.

After you clean the grill, lets **take care of the yard**. Dried leaves can be especially flammable and need to be removed from any areas near your household structures, garages, and sheds. Debris is one of the top fire causing factors in home fires, but your risk can be reduced with simple yard maintenance. Pay special attention to twigs and branches, and dead plant life that could catch fire easily when dried.

Finally, add **checking your smoke alarms** to your to-do list. If your smoke alarm is older than 10 years, it needs to be replaced. Test your smoke alarms throughout the house and be sure to have one on every level and in every living area. I hope these simple tips help with your spring-cleaning list and bring you and your family a safe and happy spring & summer season.

Summarizing extensive analysis and surveys, the Downtown Morris Master Plan concluded with a powerful statement: "The City of Morris is fortunate to have a strong and unique identity that fosters a community of involved and caring residents and stakeholders who have the collective goal of continuously maintaining and improving their City." This sentiment encompasses the people and partnerships that make our community lively and viable in an evolving world.

Transparency is key to making progress through partnership. To help residents and visitors stay informed of the happenings in our community, we launched the "More to Morris" podcast in November. These twenty-fiveto-thirty-minute conversations feature internal and external guests. So far, the roster includes Morris Police Chief Alicia Steffes, City Clerk Lori Werden, Grundy County Chamber of Commerce President & CEO Christina Van Yperen, Katy Leclair and Missy Durkin from the Morris YMCA leadership team, WCSJ's Kevin Schramm, and me. Guests speak in depth on their area of expertise, offering insight on decision making, timelines, and new business and program plans. Mayor Brown and Community Affairs Director Stan Knudson co-host, and a new episode drops every two weeks. Feedback has been positive and the reach has been significant already. Downtown Morris will welcome a new addition this summer, as Keg Grove Brewing Company takes over the former fire station on the west side of Wauponsee Street. Tanks arrived recently, marking the start of the building's redevelopment by this community-first brewer out of Bloomington.



Before opening in Morris this summer, Keg Grove Brewing Company has already become a participant in Morris events, with products available in local bars and liquor stores.

On the east side of town, Goodwill Park is undergoing complete reconstruction to better serve the needs of our community. West Side Park and McKinley Park will follow. The City was awarded State of Illinois grant funds to offset renovation costs, with more requests in the queue. Parks are a priority for economic development, and the City will continue to enhance its fourteen public parks each year. The parks assessment can be found at morrisil.org/parks-recreation.

Morris is well-positioned for our strong community mindset, unique natural assets, and financial position. Fiscal year '22 ended with a new sales tax record surpassing \$10 million. The City is on track to exceed that figure for fiscal year '23.

We should all continue to be intentional with local spending. Shipping and product costs remain high while staffing is in short supply for many industries. Stores and restaurants have had to be strategic with hours as a result. Despite this, Downtown Morris businesses continue to expand their offerings- from menus to product lines. There's never been a better time to explore our community and experience


